

## The Need

### Housing Shortage

It is a necessity to provide on-site housing at Musana Camps because the surrounding communities have no safe options for rentals. Currently all missionary housing is occupied at Musana Camps, yet we have a need to hire more missionaries as our number of camps continues to increase.

### Missionary Shortage

Because we have no available housing, we are unable to fill positions that are in need at Musana Camps. In 2018 alone, needed positions include: church pastor, accounts assistant, programs coordinator, HR Manager, and Hospitality Manager. We also have a future need to hire more teachers, clinic staff, and support staff. In addition, we value the ability to house 2 Investment Year interns, but its increasingly difficult to accommodate them.

### Missionary Care

Our ability to care for the fatherless in our community and region if East Africa hinges on our ability to provide quality programs, administrative leadership, and a professionally operated camp. In order to achieve those goals, we must be able to provide value to our employees with housing that is acceptable in our remote location. By caring for our staff, we create an environment where each individual is freed from burdens that might hold them back from their potential and ability to serve God with their respective giftings.

Short description: Duplex with 2 one-bedroom apartments, providing housing for 2 singles, married couples, or married couples with a small child.

Estimated Time of Construction: We would like to begin construction in September 2018 with a completion date of January 2019—5 months total.

Total Cost: \$48,400

We will be using an identical floorplan as another missionary duplex to be cost-effective. Musana Camps construction manager will oversee the project and progress reports will be provided on a monthly basis.
