

RICHARD & SCOVIA | ORIGINAL CHILDREN

When Richard was young, he lost his parents. His cousins sold his parents' property, leaving Richard and his sister Scovia with nothing. Richard and his sister joined New Hope Uganda in the early 1990s. At first Richard didn't like Kasana and tried to run away. Auntie Evelyn, our first nurse, found him and brought him back. Richard grew to enjoy Kasana and his academics improved. He realized he was not an orphan like others in the community; he had parents, New Hope staff, who loved him.

After completing elementary school in 2000, he completed four years of business training and then worked in Jinja where he used his earnings to pay for additional education. Later his contract job ended, leaving him without work for 8-9 months. He had recently married, and the couple's first baby, born prematurely, passed away. Auntie Nancy visited Richard, and encouraged him to take a job with NHU.

Since then, Richard has been promoted from Receptionist to Administrative Assistant with NHU. Earlier in his life, he wanted to take his cousins to court for what they did, but Scovia convinced him to build a relationship with them instead. Now they have a positive relationship with their cousins and are thankful to live near them because of their jobs with Kasana. "We have seen God using us", Richard said. "New Hope taught me how to take care of my own family.
